Clean Up of Chartley Stream

This year's clean-up was a family affair with the Leddon's (Brad, Stacy, Sean and Nick), the Loehr's (Don, Lucas and Mason), the Ownby's (David, Stacy, and Dylan) and Melinda Jeffers and Blake and Kaycee Wright. Twenty-seven bags of plastic, paper, cloth, discarded masks and gloves, and trash and debris were collected. The largest items picked up were an adult two-wheel bike, and a shopping cart. Proposed Membership Bylaw Change

The Board is proposing a change to the Membership bylaw that would allow non-homeowners and previous Chartley residents to become members. The change would be as follows:

Current:

ARTICLE III- MEMBERSHIP

Section 1. Membership in the Association shall be open to any adult individual(s) 18 years of age or older, *owning* a home within the bounds of Chartley as defined. Chartley's boundaries are set out in a plat entitled "Chartley" which is duly recorded in the land Records of Baltimore County.

Proposed:

ARTICLE III- MEMBERSHIP

Section 1. Membership in the Association shall be open to any adult individual(s) 18 years of age or older, *currently or previously residing in* a home within the bounds of Chartley as defined. Chartley's boundaries are set out in a plat entitled "Chartley" which is duly recorded in the land Records of Baltimore County.

Accompanying this change, a trade name of "Chartley Neighborhood Association, Inc." will be registered. This would be the "doing business" name to the world on signage, communications, etc. The official registered business name will remain Chartley Homeowners Association.

Voting will be done by e-mail. Members will be sent an e-mail which will indicate the ballot items. Just indicate the email "yes" or "no" and return it.

Crime In Chartley

April 2022

So far this year, we are only aware of 5 crimes (3 non-domestic assaults, and 2 general thefts, that have been reported by Chartley residents. While zero crimes is always our objective, having only 5 crimes reported in the first quarter of this year is a great start and we are certainly hoping that we will be able to continue keeping crime at very low levels the entire year. As we have stated many times over the past 3 years, the primary crime that has been reported by residents of our community has been theft from UNLOCKED vehicles. While this has not been reported so far this year in Chartley, it is happening quite frequently all around us. So, let's start there as a reminder to LOCK IT UP EACH TIME, AND THEN DOUBLE CHECK TO MAKE SURE THAT IT'S LOCKED. And that applies to everything on your property...your home, shed, vehicles, even your kids' bicycles.

With the price of gas going thru the roof lately, we anticipate that there may be an increase in shed burglaries and/or attempts to siphon gasoline from vehicles. If your gas tank cap isn't lockable, consider acquiring a lockable one. Parking your vehicles in well-lit areas at night will also help to deter this type of crime as well as helping to deter those thieves who continuously walk the streets at night pulling on vehicle door handles to see if the vehicle is unlocked. In that regard, whether it's your vehicle, your home, your shed, or anything else, once again we remind everyone to lock it up every time, and then recheck to make sure that it's locked!

Now that spring has arrived, we are receiving reports that the annual flood of unwanted sales persons knocking on our doors has started. One way to help minimize these unwanted sales people and scammers from knocking on your door is to post a "No Soliciting" sign in a prominent location where it can be easily seen by anyone walking up to your front door. Baltimore County Code prohibits people from soliciting at homes that display such signs. Violators are subject to a fine if found guilty in a court of law.

Another deterrent, that is really useful in both preventing crime and helping to solve crimes, and which is effective in preventing unwanted sales people from knocking on your door, is the growing use

of outdoor video cameras such as doorbell cameras. Thieves do not want to be photographed so they will usually go somewhere else when they see any type of camera. The vast majority of cameras being used today to help secure the outside of our homes are high definition, work well at night, record sound as well as video, and can be accessed virtually instantly from your cell phone or computer. We continue to urge all residents to seriously consider acquiring outside video surveillance cameras. They provide a very worthwhile extra layer of security around our homes, which helps with the overall security of the entire community. Many insurance companies also offer discounts on homeowner insurance policies if the resident has such cameras. All in all, these cameras are a very worthwhile investment.

The police report that a dirt bike rider was involved in an accident with a school bus near Glyndon Elementary School in March. The dirt bike rider was the only injured party and as officers were investigating the scene, a separate individual stole the dirt bike. He was later apprehended and charged. Dirt bikes that are not registered according to the Department of Motor Vehicle standards cannot be driven on Maryland roadways. We anticipate that as the weather gets warmer, we will start seeing these bikes on our streets once again. These bikes are illegal and dangerous. We need to get them off of our streets before someone gets hurt. The riders of these bikes usually disregard all the rules of the road and seem to care less about the safety of other people. If you should see one of these bikes, call 911 immediately. Try to get a description of the bikes, and the riders, as well as the direction of travel. If possible, the police are most interested in getting pictures.

Complaints have been received throughout the precinct regarding juveniles riding their bicycles directly into oncoming traffic, sometimes doing wheelies, and riding directly at oncoming vehicles. The primary areas of concern in Chartley are in the 500 Block of Gwynnwest Road and in the 400 Block of Shirley Manor Road. Bicyclists must obey the same traffic laws as drivers of automobiles. While this type of dangerous behavior seems to be subsiding, please be aware of this situation and call 911 immediately if you observe this kind of activity.

With the change of season, now is the time to take stock of the security of your home and to consider what you may need to do to make sure that you and your family do not become crime victims. As we have for several years now, we strongly recommend that, as you review your security measures, that you make sure that the following tried and true Crime Prevention Tips are included in your review:

- Lock it up, each time, every time.
- Keep the outside of your house illuminated after dark.
- Strongly consider the installation of home security cameras around your property.
- Never leave your vehicle running unattended.
- Never leave valuables in your vehicles.
- Never leave the keys to any property inside your vehicle.
- Be aware of your surroundings wherever you are, particularly when you are outside or shopping after dark.
- NEVER, EVER, FOR ANY REASON, GIVE ANY PERSONAL INFORMATION WHATSOEVER TO ANYONE UNTIL YOU HAVE VERIFIED THE SOURCE FIRST.
- If you see something, say something! Call 911 each time, every time.
- Remember that if you don't call 911, there will not be a police response... no response... no police follow up to prevent further crimes...MAKE THAT CALL, EACH TIME, EVERY TIME. And call 911 even if you do make a mistake and the criminals take advantage of you. Never be too embarrassed to make that call. You could be helping someone else by allowing the police to start closing the ring on the criminals. MAKE THAT CALL!

Examples include weather, massive utility outages and more. Alerts can be received by text, email and phone. You get to choose which method to use. To receive the alerts, you must opt into the system by registering online and you must have a valid email address.




