VOLUNTEERS NEEDED

- Where: **Sacred Heart Lane Bridge between Chartley Drive and Highmeadow Road**
- Why: **Clean the Chartley Stream**

The “Chartley Stream” flows eastward from beneath Shirley Manor Road, through the restored stream area, and joins other streams near the rail road tracks in the Gwynn Falls Watershed. When it rains storm water carries whatever is in the street storm drains and lawns into the Gwynn Falls Watershed and ultimately into the Chesapeake Bay. Debris from our streets and yards contributes to algae blooms and trash that accumulates in the Chesapeake Bay.

Failure to keep our stream clean is an eye-sore for residents, sets a poor example for our children, and decreases the property values of the homes in the Chartley community.

Everyone is invited to help. No specific skills are required. On the job training is available. Meet your neighbors at the bridge on Sacred Heart Lane, between Chartley Drive and Highmeadow Road, at 9 am. on Saturday, April 4th. Don’t forget to wear hard soled shoes or boots and clothing suitable for the weather. Gloves will be provided. For additional information call **Dan at 410-833-3197**.

Crime in Chartley

To say the least, February was NOT a good month for Chartley, at least from a crime perspective, as our residents reported 8 crimes within our community. There were 4 thefts reported and 3 cases of vandalism, which brings our year to date total to 10, as compared to 6 for the same period last year (see chart below). This increase in crime in our community is not the way we want to go, nor can we tolerate it. We cannot let the criminal element believe that we are careless, or not alert. If we do, we can expect to see our crime rate soar.

Three of the vandalism cases reported during February were actually the result of a group of individuals going thru Chartley, and parts of other communities, shooting out vehicle windows with a BB or pellet gun. Some videos of these culprits were obtained and turned over to the police, who successfully arrested suspects and confiscated a BB gun. While very

unfortunate that this incident occurred, it is also a reminder of the value of security cameras in today's environment. They are relatively inexpensive, act as a deterrent to criminals, as well as to door to door sales people and very valuable in helping the police to arrest the bad guys when crimes do occur. We strongly recommend that you give them some consideration to add another level of safety and security to your home. While these three incidents were unfortunate, and not the result of resident inattentiveness or carelessness, they do illustrate the fact that crime can hit anywhere, at any time. Even if we delete these 3 crimes from the crimes shown in the chart above, our year to date total would still be higher than last year at the same time. We still have work to do!

Now that spring is almost here, our attention will naturally turn to outside activities. We will see more children outside playing and leaving their toys, particularly their bicycles, wherever they are. Please encourage children to at least put their bicycles out of sight when they come inside, even if it is only for a few minutes. We have always had a number of bicycles reported stolen each year during warmer weather particularly on Highmeadow Road and Homevale Road. And be alert to anyone knocking on your door. We are getting reports that door to door sales people are already out and about. Be careful when dealing with these people. **If in doubt, let the police check it out!** Remember too, that our being alert does NOT stop at our property line! We must always be alert wherever we are, and report anything we see that appears suspicious by calling 911 right away. Once again, we are listing the tried and true Crime Prevention measures that will help you to avoid becoming a crime victim.

- **Lock it up, each time, every time.**
- **Keep the outside of your house illuminated after dark**
- **Strongly consider the installation of home security cameras around your property.**
- **Never leave valuables in your vehicles**
- **Be aware of your surroundings wherever you are, particularly when you are outside or shopping after dark**
- **If you see something, say something! Call 911 each time, every time.**

Remember that if you don't call 911, there will not be a police response... no response...no police fol-

low up to prevent further crimes...**MAKE THAT CALL, EACH TIME, EVERY TIME.** And call 911 even if you do make a mistake and the criminals take advantage of you. Never be too

embarrassed to make that call. You could be helping someone else by allowing the police to start closing the ring on the criminals. **MAKE THAT CALL!**

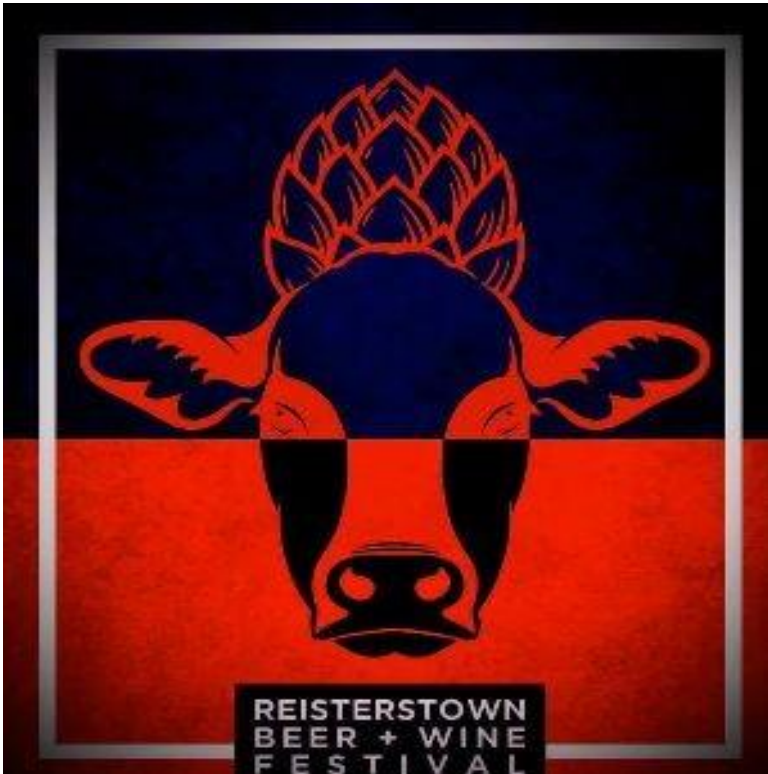
Block Captain Needed for Homevale Road
