Crime in Chartley

Unlike the month of August last year, August this year was a pretty good one from a crime perspective. Chartley residents reported two crimes during August which brings our year to date total to 24 as compared to 40 during the same period last year. But, we must also take into consideration the disastrous month of August last year when we had an explosion of crimes being reported (16), eleven of which were thefts from unlocked vehicles! I certainly hope that everyone continues to remember to always, always lock their vehicles whenever leaving them.

The table below shows all crimes reported within Chartley since the beginning of the year:

Dirt bikes have become a major concern in multiple

communities throughout Precinct 3, including Chartley. The police have made several arrests, but need the help of the public to try and get them off the streets,

and are urging the public to immediately call 911 when a dirt bike is seen anywhere within a community. Please try to get a description of the bike, the rider and the direction of travel, but if you can get some photos, that would be fantastic! Please call 911 immediately to report sightings. Captain Buckingham has personally called the 911 authorities in this area due to a complaint from a resident that when they called 911 to report dirt bikes, they were told to call the non-emergency police number instead...always call 911 for these situations. If you are able to get some photos, you can send them directly to Captain Buckingham at wbuckingam@baltimorecountymd.gov. I would appreciate it very much if you would also send me a copy of the photos so that I can follow up. You can send them to me at davidlpowers@verizon.net.

The police have also advised that there is currently a "rash" of theft from vehicles, particularly unlocked vehicles, throughout our precinct. As indicated above, we are hopeful that Chartley residents will remember "bad August 2019" when we got hit hard with 11 thefts from unlocked cars, and will continue to remember to

always check, then double check to make sure their vehicles are locked whenever exiting them.

There are two other issues which the police have asked us to alert everyone. The first is a bit strange, but the police have received multiple reports in Precinct 3 where the front license plates of resident's vehicles are being stolen. Residents are urged to check their front license plates daily and to report any loss immediately by calling 911.

Secondly, there have been a number of bicycles reported stolen throughout the precinct. This has also been a continuing problem in Chartley over the years, starting in the spring and lasting through the fall of the year. Parents are urged to take photos of their children's bicycles and to record the serial number in the event it is stolen. Please take the precaution of teach-

ing your children to always put their bikes out of sight of the street whenever they finished are riding them, even if they are only going to be away from their bikes for a few

minutes.

Now that fall is fast approaching with its diminished daylight hours, it's time for all of us to stop, think, and respond to the following Crime Prevention Tips. Don't become a crime victim!

- Lock it up, each time, every time.
- Keep the outside of your house illuminated after dark
- Strongly consider the installation of home security cameras around your property.
 - Never leave valuables in your vehicles
- Be aware of your surroundings wherever you are, particularly when you are outside or shopping after dark
- Never, ever, for any reason, give any personal information whatsoever to anyone until you have verified the source first
- If you see something, say something! Call 911 each time, every time.
 - Remember that if you don't call 911, there will

not be a police response... no response... no police follow up to prevent further crimes...MAKE THAT CALL, EACH TIME, EVERY TIME. And call 911 even if you do make a mistake and the criminals take advantage of you. Never be too embarrassed to make that call. You could be helping someone else by allowing the police to start closing the ring on the criminals. MAKE THAT CALL!

A R Workshop

Reisterstown

A few weeks ago, four Chartley friends spent a productive afternoon sanding, nailing, painting, staining and otherwise finishing our chosen wooden crafts at **A R Workshop and Art Studio**. Online it's called a boutique DIY studio. This is a new business located at 324 Main Street that provides multiple wooden craft kits for anyone who signs up. The owner is **Heather Harbin**. She and her staff are on hand to help bring the kits together and the paints and stains are instantly there ready to be used.

For a price, the customer can choose any design that's offered and with time and a small bit of effort, put their piece together and go home with a newly formed tray, cake plate, wall piece – whatever they have picked out.

It was a fun way to spend the afternoon with friends, as there was ample time to chat, look over and comment on other people's work, walk around and view other craft projects you might like to try in the future and just otherwise have a good time.

We each picked a different project and watched each craft come to life. In three plus hours, we all had a finished project. All the projects available are meant to be easily assembled. The parts necessary are pre-cut and ready to be sanded. There were high tables giving ample room to distance ourselves while we worked and aprons for our use were given to us as we arrived. In this time of COVID, the aprons were a one-user item and were then thrown in the bin to be washed. Masks were required for the staff and the customer and all instruments used by us were either discarded (i.e. sponge brushes, bits of fabric) or washed.

So, we four set to sanding our wooden project until perfectly smooth, staining or painting it, picking out a stencil and with help, placing that delicately on our work and when all was dry, peeling off the stencil and voila, seeing the finished work of art appear. It was exciting to see it all come together. My choice was a 6" tall cake stand with a Boho Quartrefoil pattern on top. They even have DIY kits to go, if you would rather work on your piece at home. It was a fun time.

Grants have been made available both from the Federal, State and County level to help businesses, schools and non-profits make up for losses COVID-19 caused so that they can stay in business and/or help support the area.

BGE Notice: The most important step a residential customer can take who is not current on their BGE bill them at 1-800-685-0123 to contact or www.BGE.com/assistance as soon as possible. There are many payment and billing options as well as energy assistance programs available for those having difficulty keeping their accounts up to date. The moratorium on service terminations will end on November 15th. BGE customers can apply for energy assistance through the Maryland Department of Human Services by contacting their Local Energy Assistance Office, or by calling the Office of Home Energy Programs at 1-800-332-6347. BGE customers who have

completed the energy assistance process with the State can also apply for further assistance with the **Fuel Fund of Maryland**.

Baltimore County Public Schools (BCPS) All students in 87 BCPS schools will receive free meals for the 2020-2021 school year. This began on the first day of the school year, Tuesday, September 8, 2020, thanks to approval of a BCPS application to the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Community Eligibility Provision (CEP). CEP allows schools in high-poverty neighborhoods to serve breakfast and lunch, at no cost, to all enrolled students without collecting household applications. In addition, the USDA announced Monday that, considering the global pandemic, its meals program, which allowed BCPS and other organizations to provide free meals to all youth throughout the summer, will be extended through December 31, 2020. The closest school pickup location is either Glyndon Elementary School or Owings Mills Elementary School.

Reisterstown Recreation Council has decided to remain closed for fall sports even though Baltimore County Recreation & Parks announced local councils could open their programs.

COVID-19 Testing Sites – If you need to get tested and don't have a pre-set location to do so, the county has offered locations. This will enhance the ability to catch early cases and identify those that may be asymptomatic. Individuals may visit any of the four County sites between 10am - 1pm on the days indicated:

 - Walk-up clinic, open Mondays
- Liberty Family Resource Center, 3535 Resource Drive, Randallstown, MD 21133. Walk-up clinic, open Mondays
- Maryland Vehicle Emissions Program (VEIP), 11510 Cronridge Drive, Owings Mills, MD 21117. Drive-through clinic, open Wednesdays and Fridays.
- Maryland State Fairgrounds in Timonium, 2200
 York Road, Timonium, MD 21093.
 Drive-through clinic, open Tuesdays and Thursdays.

Additionally, residents can check with their local pharmacies about testing availability and can call the Baltimore County COVID-19 Hotline at 410-887-3816 which is open seven days a week from 8:30am to 5pm.

Be sure to create your **Voting Plan** for this year's election! The state will be mailing out ballots to those

that request them beginning the first week of October. If you plan to vote by mail in/absentee ballot, be sure

you request it by **Clicking Here.** There are multiple ways you can submit your ballot:

- Hand deliver your ballot. You must deliver it to the local board of elections by 8:00 p.m. on November 3, 2020, or you may take it to an early voting center, an Election Day vote center, or a ballot drop off box, or a polling place before the polls close.
- Mail your ballot. If you mail your voted ballot, make sure that the envelope is postmarked on or before general election day (November 3, 2020). Your voted ballot must be received by your local board of elections by 10:00 a.m. on November 13, 2020.
- **Drop your ballot at a ballot drop off box.** Voters will have an option to submit their ballots via ballot boxes that will be placed at 13 locations throughout the County.

The closest location to our neighborhood is **Reister-stown Senior Center at Hannah More Park**, 12035 Reisterstown Road. If your choice is to vote in person, early voting will be held at the Senior Center location from Monday, October 26th through Monday, November 2nd 7:00am to 8:00pm. Check your voter registration card for the location you need to use if you wait for November 3rd to cast your vote.
