The Charley Stream flows into the Gwynns Falls, and eventually into the Chesapeake Bay. We want to keep Chartley litter out of the stream and out of the Bay. We also want to keep litter out of Charley because litter is an eye sore that detracts from our community and our property values.

Everyone is invited to join us for the cleanup. The cleanup takes 2-3 hours. Meet us at the bridge on Sacred Heart Lane at 9 am. The bridge is located on Sacred Heart Lane between Chartley Drive and Highmeadow Road. Some of the litter is in the woods, so wear sturdy shoes or boots. We will provide you with gloves and plastic bags.

Crime in Chartley

It looks like the situation with the pandemic isn't going to be resolved for a while yet, so we must continue to protect ourselves from this virus by remembering to practice social distancing and to wear a mask. But we also need to remember that we must continue to protect our homes and property as well. From a crime perspective, we really aren't doing that bad this year, but we can always do better. Chartley residents reported two more crimes during July, one of which was a theft, while the other was a vandalism case. That brings our year to date total to 22 as compared to 24 for the same period last year.

But there is a difference between the types of crimes being reported this year as compared to those in the first half of 2019. The majority of crimes reported so far this year are thefts (11) and Destruction of Property (a.k.a. Vandalism) (7), while for the same period in 2019, the majority of crimes reported were for Vandalism (9) followed by Non-Domestic Assaults (6). More than likely this difference was due to the fact that the majority of people were confined to their homes for the past 4 months due to the stay at home orders issued by Governor Hogan. Never the less, the difference indicates that we need to focus more on preventing theft and/or destruction of our property. Indeed, if everyone focuses on these two items, we can drive our crime rate much lower for the rest of this year.

The table below shows all crimes reported within Chartley since the beginning of the year:

The police have notified us that since July 22^{nd} , there have been 15 cases of theft from vehicles reported in Precinct 3, mostly in the Owings Mills area, and most occurring during the overnight hours. In some cases, the vehicles were unlocked, but there have also been some cases of "smash and grab" where the vehicles were broken into and then ransacked. We continue to urge everyone to check, and then recheck to make sure your vehicle is locked whenever you leave it, and to also park your vehicle in a well illuminated area overnight. Outdoor security cameras continue to prove

their worth and act not only to provide a record on what is going on outside your home, but they also act as a strong deterrent to crime. We recommend that all residents give them some positive consideration.

We continue to receive reports of dirt bikes being ridden on our streets by teenaged males at high rates of speed, often doing wheelies, again at high rates of speed. The police are working with us to get these dangerous and illegal bikes off our streets, and have been able to make several apprehensions, but still need our help. Once again, we are asking everyone to be extra vigilant to help us to get these bikes off our streets. If you see these bikes, please call 911 immediately to report the situation. Try to get a description of the bikes, and the riders, as well as the direction of travel. If possible, the police are most interested in getting pictures. Several of you have sent us pictures as requested, and that has been most helpful, but since they are still on our streets, we cannot stop until they are completely gone. We appreciate your continued cooperation.

As you may have noticed, the daylight hours are beginning to get shorter as we march toward autumn. The diminished daylight hours will give the criminal element more time to ply their trade in relative obscurity. Protect yourself, your family, and your home now by implementing the following Crime Prevention Guidelines:

• Lock it up, each time, every time.

• Keep the outside of your house illuminated after dark.

• Strongly consider the installation of home security cameras around your property.

• Never leave valuables in your vehicles.

• Be aware of your surroundings wherever you are, particularly when you are outside or shopping after dark.

• Never, ever, for any reason, give any personal information whatsoever to anyone until you have verified the source first

• If you see something, say something! Call 911 each time, every time.

• Remember that if you don't call 911, there will not be a police response... no response ... no police prevent follow up to further crimes... MAKE THAT CALL, EACH TIME, EVERY TIME. And call 911 even if you do make a mistake and the criminals take advantage of you. Never be too embarrassed to make that call. You could be helping someone else by allowing the police to start closing the ring on the criminals. MAKE THAT CALL!
